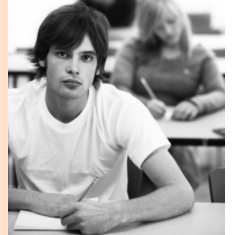

Did you know—

Families face many, many added costs when they have a member with a disability?



Things as simple as speaking, hearing, reading, riding a bike and making friends can be costly.

Examples of added costs for a child/teen/adult with challenges—

- Tutor— \$15-\$50+ per hour
- Key board for visually impaired person— \$219.95
- Therapeutic trike— \$939.00
- Specialized trike pedals— \$80.00
- Autism workshop fee— \$80.00
- Brain injury camp— \$1225.00
- Specialized walker \$190-\$300
- ADDitude (quarterly ADHD Publication for families)- \$24.99.

YOU can improve the quality of life of a child, teen or adult with a disability.
